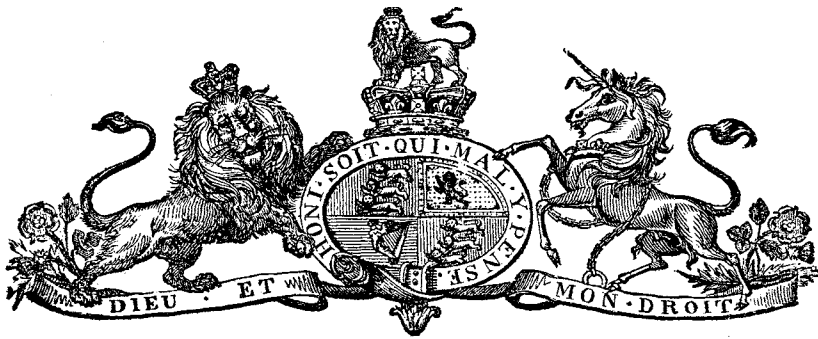

AN ACT to amend “An Act to enable the Municipal Council of *Launceston* to borrow Money upon the Security of certain Rates.”
[11 October, 1867.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 All Rates leviable under *The Launceston Improvement Act* before its repeal shall, for the purposes of the Act of the 23rd *Victoria*, No. 6, be deemed to be the Rates made and to be made and leviable under and by virtue of the 259th Section of *The Police Act*, 1865.

For purposes of 23 Vict. No. 6, Rates under 22 Vict. No. 13 to be deemed Rates under 29 Vict. No. 10.

2 In order to enable the Municipal Council of the Town of *Launceston* to pay off the moneys already borrowed by virtue of the said Act of the 23rd *Victoria*, No. 6, or any part or parts thereof, as and when the same become due and payable, or at any time or times thereafter, it shall be lawful for the said Municipal Council, and they are hereby empowered again to borrow at interest on the security of the Rates leviable under *The Police Act*, 1865, the amount so paid off, and so from time to time: Provided always, that the whole sum borrowed or to be borrowed shall not at any one time, exclusive of Interest, exceed the total sum now borrowed by virtue of the said Act of the 23rd *Victoria*, No. 6.
